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The Urban Library – Unconventional public relations strategies

Keynote speaker:

The Ethical Dilemma of Libraries

The article starts from the premises that we are now facing a major information paradigm shift, with strong moral implications, following the role that libraries should play in this context. As we are currently going through a major information paradigm shift, one that could ultimately result in the change of the way in which people define themselves as humanity. According to this article, any definition of humanity was based on an oppositional structure: we versus them. All the changes that have been made during the latest centuries have led to the broadening of the definition of a human being. We should be aware that paradigm shifts are never smooth. Those who hold the power (actual and/or symbolic) in the current old paradigm will try to preserve it, either by strongly emphasizing their position, or by weakening the position of their opponent. The problem is that paradigms have their own development, they are not the product of a single individual or of a group of individuals and their change is determined by the material change of the society. The notion of copyright is analyzed as a model of power discourse, which opposes change. The aim of this paper is to try to determine where the libraries stand in this opposition between change and the preservation of the status-quo. We have tried to analyze the behavior of the libraries starting from the differences between the definitions of the terms "ethical dilemma" and "ethical conflict". What is their vision and how do they operate in the social field? Our answer is that, for now, libraries are trying to ignore the informational paradigm shift and to position themselves outside this conflict. There are two reasons to consider this attitude inadequate. The first one is the practical one, namely that at the time of a social paradigm change, old institutions are either destroyed or disappear as a matter of course. Libraries might disappear, their place being taken by structures more appropriate to the new information paradigm. This phenomenon is neither bad nor good in itself, what is really important is not to allow their disappearance or the reduction of their social role to determine the loss of something more important than their own existence. This leads us to the second argument, namely that, over time, libraries have been the expression of a certain position in relation to knowledge and information. Keeping a "neutral" position or one of negotiation with the power authoritative discourse is no possible without the loss of identity. Libraries must choose.

Non-verbal literacy as a part of information literacy: Using emoticons in Facebook communication by seventh and eighth grade students

The proliferation of means of mass communication and new communication channels, such as Facebook, has helped spread the perception of literacy in which the non-verbal elements have become an important factor of the communication. The emoticons have, thus, become an inevitable part of Facebook communication as they can be used to better express emotions, thoughts, and attitudes of the interlocutors for whom the message is intended. The study conducted among the seventh-grade and eighth-grade students of the Ante Kovačić Elementary school in Zlatar, Croatia and the Franjo Horvat Kiš Elementary school in Lobar, Croatia in June 2013 showed that the participants who access Facebook on a daily basis and spend more time on this social network use emoticons in interpersonal and mass communication more often, think that emoticons help them put together a more precise message, and that they help the interlocutor understand the message better. Only the proper use of non-verbal elements in communication prevents the miscommunication and misunderstanding between the interlocutors, which is why mastering non-verbal literacy becomes a crucial factor for acquiring information literacy on individual level. Thus, when dealing with the concepts of modern information literacy, library literacy, media literacy, network literacy, computer literacy, and digital literacy, non-verbal literacy also represents a particularly important factor.

Video tutorials developed to support the learning process

Internet offers a wide variety of interactive tools used in the learning process or for studying specific concepts. Social media space, such as slideshare or YouTube websites, may be considered a possible and useful learning environment, by promoting various product and research results through tutorials or video presentations. The YouTube website hosts numerous „how to” video tutorials, focussed on many and various topics. This website is one of the most visited social media channels, as well as a convenient and easy way for sharing information and knowledge from different areas. In order to publish learning materials, by developing video tutorials, it is necessary to understand and to know the implementation methodology. The article briefly describes the procedure applied by "Dunarea de Jos" University Library of Galati for developing video tutorials which are beneficial and useful for a greater understanding of the reference management. Plagiarism is undoubtedly the main concern of the researchers who intend to publish the own investigation results. Nowadays, plagiarism is considered by all scientific journals to be a serious breach of scientific ethics. Usually, the editors of journals reserve the right to use plagiarism detection software on the manuscripts submitted for evaluation. On the other hand, specific software programs have been developed the last years, to easily facilitate the citation process within the research papers, projects, investigations reports etc. There are many citation management tools, useful in downloading of citations from various websites and databases, which electronically store and efficiently organize the citations and format the citations within the content of the manuscript and the references section. For instance, Zotero and Mendeley are free online programs and appropriate choices for the process of citing and creating of bibliographies. "Dunarea de Jos" University Library of Galati developed and uploaded on the slideshare platform two presentations related to their application. Besides, several free screen recording programs have been carefully studied, in order to improve the knowledge on the reference management and to increase the attractiveness of the digital tools created.

Knowledge Management in the Romanian Academic Libraries. The Directors' perspective

The digital age advances and each of its stages brings along new developments in the information exchange organizations. Libraries, as the oldest repositories of knowledge, must adapt quickly to the users' needs and manage knowledge in a variety of formats and types of organizations of the networked society. Based on the encouraging results of the first study on knowledge management (KM) in Romanian libraries conducted in 2004 among specialists of large Romanian libraries, in 2013 we conducted another study in order to assess the stage of the actual implementation of KM in these institutions and the related benefits registered over the past years. This study is part of a larger research focusing on the transformation of the Romanian academic libraries into learning organizations and it was conducted through interviews with directors of academic libraries and heads of library branches of Romania. The interviews were conducted by e-mail using a structured and open-ended questionnaire. Unfortunately, the results of this recent study are not encouraging and do not show a remarkable progress, as we had expected, concerning the understanding of the KM process and the need for its implementation in the Romanian academic libraries, but rather a step backwards and a total lack of interest in this process.

Contributions to Enhancing Effectiveness in Retrieving on-shelf Publications at the University Library

In rooms with free access shelves, publications are made available for consultation. A user might need a specific publication (book, magazine, etc.) placed in a room with free access shelves. She/he has the library registration number but she/he is unaware of the specific location of the publication. The retrieval of documents placed in rooms with free access shelves can be done quickly by using specific computer systems. These reduce the retrieval time of documents placed on free access shelves. In order to identify such publications, the relevant data should be coded. The coding may be done by using the flow-chart format. Thus, each code becomes a carrier for the information required by document storage. This paper will present a case study on ensuring the Computer Assisted retrieval of books at the Central Library (Reference Room) from the University Politehnica of Bucharest, using a specific program.

An Introduction to Clustering

Virtual learning games, possible future items in e-libraries

Nowadays libraries became more than a collection of hard copy or virtual resources. Computer science's new technologies bring the libraries closer to the readers and endow them with increasingly more features. The aim of this paper is to bring attention to virtual learning games as possible new items in the current library. In this article we consider the case of academic libraries. That is why we do not address here the virtual learning games for kids, even if they also could have the same importance in a library section dedicated to children. We are interested in introducing a type of virtual learning games capable to stimulate somebody to read and learn more in order to complete the game. We present the design and implementation details of such a game acting in the field of Informatics and Information Technologies. The game takes the advantage of the modern game engine capabilities and embeds learning puzzles in the story line. A help system provides the player with useful references to be read in order to find the right

answer. The game analysis reveals that it can engage the player in a multiple references study. It is therefore suitable to find this kind of virtual games in the library where all references are available.

Digitization for the Europeana Cloud of a calendar from the Brukenthal Library collection: "Neu und Alter Siebenburgischer Provinzialkalender" (1797-1891)

The aim of this paper is to deal about a digitized calendar from the Brukenthal Library collection, a calendar which was printed continuously for almost a century in Sibiu. Despite the fact that it was written in German, the periodical was published both for the German minority, and for the Romanians, which represented the main population in Sibiu. The editors were Transylvanian Germans – three generations of the same family, Barth, as well as von Closius, the son in law of the last Barth family member –, but they were specialists in publishing Romanian books. For this reason, they were able to offer information which was regarded as being useful either for the native and for the non-native German speakers, namely Romanians.

The above mentioned situation represents only one aspect of the problem: that of a provincial multicultural society. The other aspect, that of a Central European multicultural society, is represented by the content of the calendar itself. In this respect, in *Neu und Alt Siebenbürgischer Provinzialkalender* one can find information not only from Transilvania – in other words, from a province –, but also from the capital, Vienna, as well as from different parts of the former Habsburg Empire – generally known, in German, as *die Donau Dynastie* ('The Danube Dynasty') – and, beginning with 1867, the year of a major political shift in the Central Europe, from Austro-Hungary.

This paper presents the digitalisation of poetry manuscript from the 19th century. The manuscript features, apart of poetry, which is an autobiography of a peasant, popular songs connected to the events, among which the most notable is the 1848 revolution. The digitalisation was made for both print publication (for classical libraries) as well as for media publication (e-book), and this should make possible analysis work on it. Connections to Hungarian institutions have been built up to facilitate this.
