CONFERENCE OVERVIEW

The conference was organised by the „Lucian Blaga” University of Sibiu and the Central Library of the University in cooperation with University of Bayreuth Library (Germany) and Evangelische Akademie Siebenbürgen. The multitude of topics that were approached was possible due to the generous limits of the field of interest, and also of the multitude of changes that happen in the information science.

The 6th edition of the Conference was officially opened at the Centre for Academic Meeting of ULBS (6 Banat Street), the chair being Cristina Albu (Central Library of Politehnica University, Bucharest) and Constantin Ittu (Library of the Brukenthal National Museum, Sibiu).

Thematic presentations and working groups (Open Science in the Library, Libraries in the Cloud, Social Media and Library) addressed the issues most pertinent for observing and getting accustomed to implement new results in technology, informatics and managerial strategies, including (1) analysis of citation databases, (2) linked data and the semantic Web, (3) 3M Cloud Library, (4) social networking Library, (5) digital age and ethical dilemmas, (6) access to documentation resources, education, training and research, (6) owner identification in digital image collections, (7) document classification software, (8) digitization, (9) achievements/projects of particular libraries, and so on.

The main goal of the conference was to present and discuss the new trends in the following areas:

- Information literacy and education
- Information science and technologies
- The future of libraries
- Social media and the library.

With the help of our partner (The Library of „1 Decembrie 1918” University) in Alba-Iulia, we could visit the University Library, The Romanian Great Union Museum (The National Centre for Restoration and Conservation of Old Books), The “Batthyaneum” Documentary Library, and cathedrals in Alba-Iulia and in Sebes.

Batthyaneum Library of Alba Iulia was established in July 31, 1798, at the initiative of the Transylvanian Roman Catholic Bishop Ignác Batthyány (1741-1798). Along with an astronomical observatory and several book collections, the library was a part of the cultural foundation of public interest created by the Bishop as Batthyani’s Institute of Alba Iulia.
