Această reuniune a reprezentat cea de a XIII-a Adunare Generală a unei asocieri informale anterioare, stabilite la inițiativa secretarului general al Parlamentului European, în iunie 1988.

Rolul EUROLIB este de a promova o mai largă implicare a bibliotecilor în activitatea instituțiilor pentru care asigură servicii de informare și documentare. EUROLIB contribuie la creșterea performanței profesionale a personalului din biblioteci prin dezvoltarea colaborării între toate tipurile de astfel de instituții; de asemenea, încearcă să ajute bibliotecile membre (link către membrii EUROLB) să realizeze economii în investițiile pentru tehnologie și pentru achiziții prin intermediul rețelei și a altor parteneriate, promovând controlul bibliografic complet și servicii de comunicarea documentelor.

Eurolib provides a forum for European Community and Associated libraries to share experience and best practices through regular meetings and staff exchanges.

The **EUROLIB** co-operation group was established on the initiative of the Secretary-General of the European Parliament and met for the first time in June 1988. Eurolib is the oldest cooperation group among EU bodies. It met regularly until its 13th General Assembly in Dublin in April 1997 as a working group focussed on broad objectives addressing the promotion of comprehensive bibliographic control and library and document delivery services in the field of European integration.

At the 13th General Assembly on 18 April at the European Foundation for the Improvement of Living and Working Conditions, **EUROLIB** members adopted by Resolution an agreement formalising the conduct of business under a preamble recognising *"the importance now given by the European Union to the development and networking of libraries"* and seeking *"to facilitate the partnership of EUROLIB member libraries in programmes contributing to the advance of new technology within European Institutions, to the more efficient use of library resources, and to improved access to EUROLIB collections"*.
