The way in which processes such as learning, teaching, research, and documentation are organized and carried out, but also their objectives and evaluating criteria have experienced significant changes over time. The main institutions wherein such activities take place, be it schools, universities, libraries or other types of structures, have also undergone substantial transformations. For an analysis of the latest developments in this field, this paper addresses the way in which universities and libraries have integrated new technologies and applications based on the samewithin their activity to facilitate and improve the learning and information processes. Many higher education institutions have sought to incorporate digital games into the educational process, starting from the idea that such process would provide a better involvement of students in the learning process. In some cases, there was even substantial support for creating gaming-based environments. These are allegedly useful for the problem solving process and the development of communication skills. Efforts for the digitization of the books in Romania (2008-2018). Challenges and achievements

The books modelled in time consciousness and mentalities, presenting a continuously increasing cultural, social and national function. In the same time, the books have economical function, due to the fact that the editing formulas, the costs, the destinations and the priority of the contents are aspects with a rapid dynamics. The 21st century is the time when the effort of the Romanian historical research makes visible efforts to synchronise with the tendencies of the EU research, through researches concretised in working instruments, destined to support the resize and the fluidisation of the knowledge, integrating it into a dynamic scientific circuit. These efforts, either belonging to a singular researcher or to a collective of researchers, target at the present time ambitious aims related not only to the scientific investigation of the books, but also to the development of strategies meant to ensure the rapid access to information. Thus, the digitization of the cultural and scientific values as preservation of the identity and support for future researches represents only one cultural strategy, in full progress in Romania.

Important roles in this matter have the Directives and the Recommendations of the European Union, who initiated and supported a common policy for the entire European space, including through projects financed directly by the European Commission, e.g. Europeana Digital Library in 2008. The Romanian specialised institutions answered to these directives and recommendations so, starting with 2008, there is in Romania an institutionalised effort for the preservation and valuing of the Romanian patrimony through digitization. The present study aims, at a decade distance from the beginning of the institutionalised efforts for the digitalization of the patrimony, an analysis of the concrete achievements and of the Romanian stage in the digitization of the cultural patrimony, especially the digitization of the books.

A Study in Gold: Top Romanian Academic Journals and Their Open Access Policies

The study aims to offer an image of the Romanian Open Access journals indexed in Web of Science and Scopus. After the identification of the Romanian journals included in these bibliometric databases, some characteristics, such as their inclusion in DOAJ and/or ROAD, the use of Creative Commons licenses and the application of processing/submission charges are presented. The conclusions of this analysis offer a perspective on the Open Access movement and its influence on Romanian scientific publishers.

The use of mobile applications in the libraries activity

Nowadays, the use of computers in library activities management became a necessity. There are many applications addressed to libraries management but most of them are dedicated only to some particular activities like books inventory or management of useful information for customers. Most of these applications are desktop applications. On the other hand, a major trend of our day is to spend as little time as possible for each activity. Here we can include shopping, renting books and others.

The aim of this paper is to propose a mobile app designed for improving the management of library activities offering in the same time to customers the possibility of easier access from distance to library services.

We conducted a survey of different applications to manage activities in different areas involving a customer relationship. This survey has revealed many useful features. We've combined many of these features in a new way and created an easy-to-use application. One feature is the ability to create a wish list. Another nice feature is to share the list of books read with friends on social media.

We named our mobile application “Library Management System”. The focus of the application, in the first version, is to offer a booking system, on smartphones, for favourite books . Assuming that the reader wants some books but does not have enough time to wait at the library, he can reserve preferred books and after that he can see the details about booking date or when he should return the book to the library. Starting with this, we aim to create a link our application to the electronic inventory of different libraries, allowing readers to see if a book is available in a library.

Our project is divided into two applications, one for librarians and one for readers. The one created for librarians is used to manage book inventory (add / remove books), to prepare rental orders, and to make other settings for the customer application. The client application allows the reader to view books by category, create a rental order, and have a rental history. As a future development, we want to give our users the opportunity to see more information about the book (for example, the book summary), expand the returning term of books, and so on.

In conclusion, we provide a mobile application to help librarians in the management of the digital books inventory and the customers in accessing library services and managing the renting books process. The use of our application will also diminishes the paper usage in the books management activities.

Using intelligent systems to promote e-libraries on social media

This research presents an autonomous intelligent system which can be used to interactively promote libraries or other text-based organizations, based on machine learning technologies and user-generated data. The proposed system consists of three main phases: a learning phase where a Recurrent Neural Network is trained using a selected number of texts, a data-analysis phase where we search and classify users-generated content to model their preferences and a final phase, where the information is used to make targeted recommendations for the potential readers. User data can be provided on-line via social-media applications or off-line for large data sets which provide better results. Social media can be used to automatically promote the selected items to the corresponding users and even choose which users should be targeted for a better reach, based on their social network.

The aim of this paper is to present the design and development of a Mobile Augmented Reality based application, capable to offer a new way of viewing the photos and panoramas. The main idea is that the user can visualise a photo and interact with it.

Our app gives the user the possibility to use its own smartphone to enjoy the benefits of augmented reality when visualising a photo collection in a digital library.

The app uses recent IT technologies to increase the interest of readers in accessing the photos collections.

Different kinds of interactions will be possible: displaying information about the photo, displaying 3D objects on the photo and animating them.

The overall project intended benefits are to increased knowledge in the field of photography, to capture the multicultural views of European (early) photographers, and increase the value of the cultural heritage, making a lift from the 2D photo to a 3D scene through the new IT technologies.

Improving the Web search using search engines query modifiers

The amount of information stored in the Web is huge and without help from search engines it becomes almost impossible to find what you want. The search engines try to index as many web pages as possible. For example, the actual number of indexed web by the Google and Bing search engines is given by <http://www.worldwidewebsite.com/>. On April 3rd 2018 there were over 45.5 billion webpages indexed by Google and just over 4 billion web indexed by Bing. Even with the help of search engines, the number of addresses of pages returned by them for a simple query is quite large and we, as people, must look through those pages to find what we are really interested in. Finding the URLs in such huge data space is challenging and requires some special techniques for refining and reducing the number of returned addresses. Anomaly detection on the real production traffic

Information about user activity which are collected by web servers is becoming bigger and bigger and the ability to monitor and protect this information becomes critical. Due to this large amount of information, automated detection of certain anomalies in them is very important in areas such as network communication problems, network intrusion detection, fraud and server monitoring. Anomalies are referred to the problem of finding patterns in data that do not match to the expected behavior, and anomaly detection is intended to detect those patterns that are different from the rest of the data. This article presents a series of methods taken from the statistical data analysis to modify data representation so that we can more easily detect anomalies. To analyze the proposed methods, we used datasets provided by Yahoo, which are labeled datasets. As learning

algorithm, the Fuzzy C-Means algorithm is used, which allows us to learn the gain confidence for each of the analyzed samples that belonging or not to the anomaly category. Representing data normalized as relative to their average generate the best results in detecting anomalies.

The first permanent studio opened in 1854 and until the end of WWI there were active about 37, some of them ephemerides, while others functioned for tens of years. "Open the Book": Devotional Gesture Regarding the Old Romanian Orthodox Prayer Books

The paper is aiming at presenting the meaning as well as the symbolism of a devotional gesture regarding the old Romanian Orthodox Prayer books, namely open the book or, deschidera cărții, în Romanian. In order to be fulfilled, the gesture or the practice needs the presence of (at least) two characters, one being the priest, and the other one, either a religious believer or group of believers. Within this framework, the priest should be regarded as a consecrated person, and not as a magician. The third element of the ritual is the devotional prayer book, which has to be open by the religious believer, under the priest surveillance. The ritual is regarded as belonging to the Christian Orthodox Tradition, not as a pre-Christian ritual which survived through the ages.

**The Archbishopric of Vasile Moga (1810-1845).
Documentary contributions to a possible actualization
of the research regarding Moga's Period**

The present material aims at realising an excursion into the Transylvanian universe at the beginning of the 19th century, marked by the re-installation of the Romanian Orthodox hierarchy due to the bishop Vasile Moga (1774-1845). The article focuses on the context and the machinations behind bishop V. Moga's consecration, the ecclesiastical and architectural policy (bishop V. Moga being the first spiritual leader that has managed to get into the fortress of Sibiu through acquiring a new building), the educational guidelines (through the foundation of "the priests' school" and of "the teachers' school" from Sibiu as well as supporting some young students within the great European universities), the bishops' relations with the subordinated clergy (priests, protopopes, consistory assessors, theologians) and practice of promoting, the relation with the Greek-Catholic Church from Transylvania and also the relation with the scholar Gheorghe Lazar. Significant passages are dedicated to the comparative analysis of the personality and of the activity of the two great Transylvanian Orthodox leaders from the 19th century: Vasile Moga and Andrei Saguna.
